disabilities. During 2023, our phenomenal staff reached an astounding 97,801 people, 17,275 through direct services, across seven programs, and 80,526 via prevention education and community outreach. All of our emergency essential services were implemented 24 hours daily, seven days a week. We provided 11,971 nights of emergency shelter and 35,913 meals to adults and children fleeing the horrors of domestic violence. Additionally, 5,000 emergency hotline calls were fielded out of our 24-hour emergency shelter. We had a very busy year with preparation for Council on Accreditation (COA) Reaccreditation and the successful achievement of various milestones required by COA. We completed the preliminary COA self-study 9 months ahead of schedule and look forward to welcoming COA towards the end of the next fiscal year. We revised our bylaws, and achieved strategic plan goals at 96%, and operational plan goals at 97%, while completely revamping Guardian Angel's website into a state of the art user friendly online medium. I was honored to continue to represent Guardian Angel on the Illinois Council on Women and Girls, and as Chair of the Gender Based Violence Committee, and in new positions
